Preface

The undisputed leader of the Bengalis, the great architect of independence and the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman established the University Grants Commission of Bangladesh on February 15, 1973 by Presidential Order No. 10, intending to build a prosperous Golden Bengal (Sonar Bangla). The official journey of the Commission began on December 16, 1972, the first Victory Day of Independent Bangladesh. Under the obligation of Section 12 of the UGC Act, the Commission has been consistently presenting the Annual Report to the National Parliament through the Government, compiling the data and statistics of the activities carried out in all the universities of the country. Since its inception, the Commission has been performing this responsibility smoothly.

As the area of work, structure and stature of higher education have increased; the scope of work of the University Grants Commission has also increased to a great extent. However, meeting the overall needs of higher education with the existing human resources and infrastructure and meeting the challenges of the 21st century in keeping pace with the changing world have become major challenges for the commission. It is well known that there is no alternative to quality higher education, research and building a knowledge-based society if Bangladesh is to occupy a more prestigious position in the world. The importance of higher education in acquiring knowledge and skills is not only a demand of the time but also undeniable. University is a center of innovation and knowledge. The role of the university is important in forming a scientific and rational free-thinking mind. The main goal of higher education is to create, disseminate and retain new knowledge. The University Grants Commission of Bangladesh as a unitary and statutory body of higher education has been properly doing its work since its inception.

As of December 31, 2021, the number of public and private universities in the country has increased to 158. These include specialized universities including general, engineering, science and technology, agriculture, medicine, marine, and aerospace. It can be said with certainty that these universities will channel the human resources of Bangladesh in a positive direction in the next few decades. In 2021, the total number of students studying in the universities of Bangladesh is 44,41,717. In the era of the fourth industrial revolution, these students will enrich themselves in various intellectual fields and take the country to a new height of leadership in the advancement of science, art and information technology. Under the leadership of these young students, Bangladesh will become an unprecedented destination for knowledge, science, information technology, agriculture, arts, finance and management. Bangladesh's progress in the Global Human Development Index, Sustainable Development

Goals 2030, Vision 2041, Independence Centenary Celebration Vision 2071, and Delta Plan 2100 will help fulfill the dream of the Father of the Nation, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. However, adequate financial support, national spirit and a structured and timely action plan are needed to achieve this goal.

University Grants Commission of Bangladesh has taken into consideration the global perspective of higher education and has adopted multi-faceted programs for the expansion and sustenance of quality education, and research programs at the university level. If these programs are properly implemented, the commission hopes that Bangladesh will advance to a great extent in the field of higher education. Along with this, the implementation of the 'Strategic Plan for Higher Education 2018-2030' is ongoing to streamline higher education and research. Its timely implementation will facilitate and consolidate the higher education of the country and accelerate the implementation of visions announced by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina.

I strongly believe that the Commission's 48th Annual Report will serve the needs of the Government, educational policymakers, planners, researchers and general readers in providing updated information on various aspects of higher education, relevant policymaking, planning and implementation.

It should be noted that because the universities are not able to send the data properly on time sometimes or because the received data contains mismatches, it is time-consuming to edit, revise and rewrite them, prepare copies and complete the printing process. Despite the commission's efforts and plans, the Annual Report is delayed every year. The commission continues to make earnest efforts to avoid this undesired delay.

Finally, I express my sincere thanks and gratitude to all the officers and staff of the publication branch, including the editorial board, engaged in the preparation and publication of the Annual Report 2021.

Chief Editor's Note

'Where access to knowledge is restricted, where intelligence is bounded, liberation is impossible', that is, knowledge acquisition is inevitable for national liberation. Quality higher education and research pave the path to knowledge. Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman established the University Grants Commission of Bangladesh on 16 December 1972 with the far-reaching goal of building a talented and knowledgeable nation by ensuring quality higher education. By establishing the UGC, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman highlighted the importance and necessity of higher education to the nation. According to Section 12 of the UGC Act, the Commission publishes an Annual Report every year. In continuation of this, the 48th Annual Report has been prepared incorporating the data and statistics of the annual activities of all the universities of the country and the Commission during the period from 1st January to 31st December 2021.

In 1973, the journey of higher education at the university level started in Bangladesh with only six public universities. Nowadays the area of higher education has increased tremendously. As of December 31, 2021, the number of universities in Bangladesh has increased to 158. Currently, the number of students studying in these higher education institutions is 44,41,717. If this large number of students can be developed as human resources with modern technology and skill, they can play an important role in the implementation of Sustainable Development Goals 2030, Vision 2041, Independence Centenary Celebration Vision 2071 and Delta Plan 2100.

It is essential to develop our human resources with timely knowledge and skills during the unprecedented development of information technology under the influence of the fourth industrial revolution (4IR). Quality higher education and research support are needed to develop a skilled and functional human resource. Because quality higher education based on research and technology is the motto to becoming a developed Bangladesh. That's why Innovative Education Ecosystem (IEE) is very important. Due to the priority and generosity of the present Government in the field of higher education, funding has been increased for various research projects including encouragement for research work. The commission has been working tirelessly to ensure that the research findings are marketable and patentable.

University Grants Commission of Bangladesh has working as a single and statutory body for supervision and guidance of higher education. In recent years, the uses of information technology and modern training have increased the capacity and scope of service delivery of the commission. As a part of this, the UGC has introduced online services for research support to streamline the operations of the Research Support and Publication Division. To make the universities of the country dependent on digital technology, initiatives have been taken to create uniform university management software and an integrated university information management platform. If these initiatives are implemented at the university level,



besides availing the facilities of digital Bangladesh, it will be possible to save incidental costs.

Digital Bangladesh is now a reality under the leadership of Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina. The University Grants Commission is also leading in the field of higher education in implementing the vision of Digital Bangladesh. As part of using ICT tools the necessary initiatives have already been taken to make all services online, including the launch of e-Nothi. New innovations and applications of technology are being greatly encouraged to make services accessible and convenient.

Despite the sincere efforts made by the UGC to publish the Annual Report at the expected time, it was not possible due to various obstacles. Timely data and statistics are not available from most of the universities as per the demand of the Commission. Many inconsistencies and deviations were observed at the stage of verifying the data obtained. In this case, the universities are needed to be contacted multiple times to correct and revise them. This causes unwanted delays which are not desirable at all. The Commission strongly believes that if the entire process is digitalized through dynamic software and all the universities can be connected with it, the Annual Report will be published on time.

The Annual Report 2021 provides updated information on higher education, setting future directions and goals, and providing guidance on developing and implementing contemporary strategies and plans. We strongly believe that the said report will meet the vast needs of the Government, higher education stakeholders, researchers, journalists and general readers.

Finally, I would like to express my gratitude to the Chief Patron of the Editorial Board and Honorable Chairman of the Commission Professor Dr. Kazi Shahidullah for the smooth and beautiful publication of the Annual Report 2021. Sincere thanks to the esteemed members of the Editorial Board for their tireless efforts. Sincere thanks to all the concerned personnel associated with the publication including printing staff, whose untiring efforts have enabled us to publish the 48th Annual Report 2021.

1. **University Grants Commission of Bangladesh**

1.1 Role and Responsibilities of the Commission

Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman realized the significance of a knowledge-based society. By following vision of the Father of the Nation, the University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh was established by the President's Order (P.O.) No. 10 of 15 February 1973 which was deemed to have come into force with effect from 16 December 1972, the first Victory Day of the newly born Bangladesh. The Commission's role and responsibilities under this Order are as follows:

- to determine the needs for university education and formulate specific plans for the development of such education;
- to determine the financial needs of universities:
- c. to receive funds from the Government and thus allocate the grants for maintenance and overall demands and needs of the development sector in universities;
- d. to evaluate the development activities of departments, institutes and other affiliated institutions:
- to submit recommendations after reviewing all development plans of universities;
- to collect statistics and additional information related to universities and higher education:
- g. to advise the Government with regard to setting up new universities and expansion of existing ones;
- h. to advise the Government on proposals to grant the right to confer special degree awarding status on colleges that may be considered suitable for such status;
- exercise such other powers and perform such other functions as may be conferred on it by any law or by the Government;
- The Commission shall have the right to visit the Universities or to have them visited by teams of experts as and when necessary to evaluate their programs and assess their needs and requirements.

In addition, the Government allocates necessary funds against the Commission in compliance with this Order of 1973 for development and maintenance, higher education and research and fulfilling the responsibilities entrusted to the Commission.

In 2021, the number of Class-I and Class-II Officers in the Commission is 128, the number of Class-III employees is 77 and the number of Class-IV employees is 97. The total number of Officers and Staff in the Commission is 302 in the same year. More information is displayed in Annexure 1 of the main report, page number 391.

3. Executive Summary of the Report

The Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman had experienced the importance and need for quality of higher education in Bangladesh to build a knowledgebased society. Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman established The University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh on 16 December 1972, which was later obtained as an autonomous institution of higher education under the President's Order No.10 of 15 February 1973. The UGC has been giving assistance and advice to the Government to develop and upgrade the country's tertiary education in different ways since its inception. The Commission has been working persistently for the overall development of Bangladesh's higher education in line with the education system of the developed world. New universities are constantly being established for the expansion of higher education in the country. As a regulatory body of universities, the UGC needs to be empowered by enacting laws for smooth and effective overseeing the administrative and academic functions of a vast number (more than 150 universities) of higher educational institutions in the country. It is undeniable that producing a skilled workforce to survive in the era of the 4th industrial revolution and globalization of information technology is highly crucial. To this end, the role of streamlining the multi-dimensional measures undertaken by the UGC in the expansion of the quality of education and research activities in Bangladesh has witnessed landmark improvements over the past decade. The UGC has been working for the up-gradation, expansion and onward advancement of higher education, keeping the goals of Muhammad Kudrat-e-Khuda Education Commission Report 1974, National Education Policy 2010, Private University Act 2010 and Rio 20⁺ Conference's Sustainable Development Plan. As a monitoring body, the Commission has been performing its assigned responsibilities properly to expand the quality of education and research in universities by undertaking multi-faceted initiatives. In an attempt to alleviate the sufferings of admission seekers and reduce the costs of the guardians, an initiative has been taken to introduce admission in a cluster system and admission tests, in this case, have already been held in agricultural and agro-based universities. It is expected that keeping admission tests in cluster/combined systems in general, science and technology and engineering universities will be possible step by step.

In 1973, higher education began at the university level in Bangladesh with only 6 Public universities. The substantial expansion of higher education has taken place in the country at present. The number of Public and Private universities has stood at 158 till 31st December 2021 (50 Public and 108 Private), of which academic activities have not started in 6 Private universities (information and data on IBAIS University, The University of Comilla and Queen's University have been added as directed by the Commission). The total enrollment at Public and Private Universities together with affiliated and constituent colleges/madrasas is 46,90,876. It will be possible to implement Vision 2021, Sustainable Development Goals 2030, Vision 2041, Vision 2071 and Centennial Delta Plan, commonly known as Delta Plan 2100, declared by the Honourable Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, provided this huge number of students could be turned into skilled manpower by training them with the updated technical knowledge and skills.

According to information gathered from the universities, in 2021, the number of faculties has increased by 7, Research Center 48, Language Center 2, and affiliated and constituent colleges 7. This number indicates of expansion of academic activities. It is observed that there are 5 institutes, 399 faculties and 1,701 departments/programs/ subjects analyzing the data sent from 108 private universities (out of which 6 have not started their academic activities) in the same year.

The total number of students in 50 public universities, including affiliated and constituent colleges/madrasas in 2021 stands at 41,31,610, of which 26,41,401 are male and 19,70,209 female students. The percentage of male and female students of total students is 52 and 48 respectively at public universities. In 108 private universities, the total enrollment is 3,10,107, of which 2, 15,090 students are male and 95,017 are female. To this end, the percentage of male and female students in the total is 69 and 31 respectively. The total number of students at public, including affiliated and constituent colleges/madrasas and private universities, stands at 44,41,717, of which 23,76,491 are male students and 20,65,226 female. The percentage of male and female students of total learners from public and private universities to this end is 54 and 46 respectively. In the same year, the total number of international students in public and private universities is 2281. The number of international students at public and private universities is 677 and 1,604 respectively.

In the same year, the number of students studying free of cost is 15,042, enjoying scholarship facilities 77,500 and waiver facilities 14,283 in the private universities. Heroic freedom fighters are the country's best offspring. The present Government implements various programs for them considering their financial well-being and social status. 3% of total seats have been reserved for the children of heroic freedom fighters and 3% Of the total seats for poor but deserving students in the Private University Act 2010 for pursuing higher studies free of cost. As a result, 1,688 offspring of heroic freedom fighters and 10,569 poor and meritorious students have the opportunity to study in various private universities without any expense in the same year.

In 2021, the total number of teachers at 50 public universities (including four new universities and affiliated and constituent colleges/madrasas) is 1,48,584 of which 1,22,092 are male while the remaining 24,492 teachers are female. The total number of teachers at the country's 108 universities in the private sector stands at 15,393. Among them, 10,394 are male teachers and 4,999 are female. The total number of teachers in public and private universities is 1,63,977, of which 1,32,486 are male and 31,491 female. It may be mentioned here that the total number of teachers at 50 public universities, excluding four new universities and affiliated and constituent colleges/madrasas, is 15,236, of which 11,010 are male and 4,226 female. According to the data gathered from the universities in 2021, the number of teachers having PhD is 5,606, the total number of teachers with MPhil/Equivalent degrees is 1,184, and the number of teachers having other degrees is 8,446 while in 2010, the number of teachers having PhD is 5,651, the number of teachers with MPhil/Equivalent degrees 999 and the number of teachers having other degrees is 8,776, totaling 15,426. About 77% of teachers from 15,236 in 50 public universities were engaged in teaching in 2021 while the remaining 23 percent were absent, which is having an adverse impact on students and the quality enhancement of higher education in the country.

In 2021, the total number of halls/dormitories in 50 public universities (excluding National University, Bangladesh Open University and Islamic Arabic University) is 260 and the total number of students, in this case, is 2,89,645. Among them, accommodation facilities enjoying students stand at 1,04,852, which is nearly 36%. 3123 teachers out of 15,005 of 50 public universities were provided residential facilities in the same year. To this end, about 21% of teachers have availed of accommodation facilities. A total of 4,410 officers-staff out of 34,039 in 50 public universities, excluding affiliated and constituent colleges/madrasas have enjoyed residential facilities, which is approximately 13%. Out of the employees availing of residential facilities in 2021, the number of officers is 1,159, which is about 11% and the number of staff stands at 3,251, which is nearly 15%.

If we compare the share of the total education budget and the share of the national budget in the management commission budget and public universities in the education sector in the past years, we can see that the national budget (management and development) of the fiscal year 2019-2020 was 5,01,576.86 Crore. The education budget (management and Development)

was 52,103.27 Crore and Commission and University Budget (Administration and Development) was allocated 4,344.40 Crore. According to the financial year 2019-2020, the share of the commission and university in the education budget was 8.34%; and the share of the commission and university in the national budget was 0.87%.

5,68,000.00 Crore in National Budget (Operation and Development), 58,059.20 Crore in the Education Budget (Operation and Development), and 5,206.47 Crore in Commission and University Budget (Operation and Development) were also allocated in the fiscal year 2020-2021.

According to the financial year of 2020-21, the share of commission and university in the education budget was 8.97% and the share of commission and university in the national budget was 0.92%, which is 0.63% more than the commission and university of the education budget from the previous fiscal year and 0.05 % more compared to the commission and university allocation in the national budget.

The Research Support and Publication Division of the UGC, on a regular basis, provides various kinds of scholarships/fellowships along with inviting research projects for conducting research activities at the country's university level due to the immense importance of research in higher education. In 2021, a Post-doctoral fellowship has been awarded to 10 researchers, PhD fellowship to 37 teachers, a Merit scholarship to 132 students, UGC Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Fellowship, National Professorship to 3, Rokeya Chair to 1 renowned researcher and UGC Professorship to 5 distinguished researchers inclusive of financial allocation of Tk.1,58,08,790,00 for 894 research projects.

The connecting process between different countries of the world and our universities is running under the BdREN Trust. At present, 95 institutions (35 Public, 55 Private, 01 International University, 02 Research Institutes and 02 Training institutes) are availing of BdREN service. Students, teachers and researchers from member institutions have access to more than 44,000 e-resources (31,000+e-books and 13,000+e-journal proceedings) of the world's 13 well-established publishers through UDL.

To formulate a modern, time-befitting and quality curriculum in higher education, the Outcome Based Education (OBE) Curriculum Template has been prepared (latest edition) and the formulated OBE Template has been sent to the country's all public and private universities for implementation by 30 June 2021. At the same time, it has been uploaded to the UGC's website (www.ugc.gov.bd). To spreading the concept of OBE, several workshops are organized by OBE experts. In 2021, 265 teachers have been trained from 23 public and 30

private universities in the country. In 2020-2021 fiscal year, OBE has been approved in 14 public and private universities. Universities have been directed to develop the curriculum according to the Dual Semester OBE template provided by UGC. In addition, a thirteen-year Strategic Plan for Higher Education (SPHE) in Bangladesh: 2018-2030 formulated by the Commission and approved by the Government of Bangladesh is now in the implementation stage. 41 (Forty-one) Action Plans adopted in the strategic paper will be implemented in three phases. In order to implement of thirteen-year Strategic Plan for Higher Education (SPHE) the feasibility study for DPP is running for the formation of the National Research Council (NRC), Central Research Laboratory (CRL) and University Teachers' Training Academy (UTTA).

Institutional Quality Assurance Cell, better known as IQAC, has been established to ensure the quality of higher education to 114 public and private universities, and the rest of the universities have been directed to establish the IQAC. In association with British Council, the UGC takes the initiative to strengthen Excellence in Teaching and Learning (ETL) in universities, opening the Going Global Program, and Community Engagement Program, organizing Regional Policy Dialogue on Higher Education and Research, and developing the Blended Learning Policy, Pedagogy, Andragogy and Heutagogy. Under SDGs indicator-9.5.2, to collect the data from university full-time researchers, an information template has been developed, and the data and analysis will be displayed in an additional chapter of the Annual Report of UGC.

Taking the global perspective into consideration, the UGC's endeavor to build Bangladesh as a knowledge-based developed and prosperous country through ensuring quality, life-oriented and practical education alongside advanced research has remained underway. The recommendations made by the Commission have been placed in this report. It is hoped that the quality of education and research in the country will be further improved if these recommendations get properly implemented and by 2041, the goal of expansion and improvement of the quality of higher education will be achieved.

4. Significant Aspects of the Report

- * The University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh provides research grants in higher education in three sections. Firstly, the allocation of funds is for various research projects directly proposed by the teachers of the universities to the Commission. The amount was Tk. 11.50 Crore in 2018-2019 fiscal year (FY), Tk. 15.00 Crore in 2019-2020 fiscal years and Tk. 15.50 Crore in 2020-2021 fiscal years. The growth rate from 2018-19 fiscal years to 2019-20 fiscal years is 23.33% and from 2019-20 fiscal years to 2020-21 fiscal years, the growth rate is 3.33%. Secondly, the allocation of funds goes for the budget of universities for research grants (regular) and research grants (special). In 2018-19, 2019-20 and 2020-21 fiscal years, research grants allocated to regular and special sectors in the budget of universities were Tk. 61.90 Crore, Tk. 64.58 Crore and Tk. 75.39 Crore respectively. The growth rate from 2018-19 fiscal years to 2019-20 fiscal years is 4.33% and from 2019-20 fiscal years to 2020-21 fiscal years, the growth rate is 14.39%.
- * Comparing the share of the total education budget in the education sector of the Commission and universities in the operational budget and the share in the national budget in the past years, it is seen that Tk. 501576.86 Crore was allocated in the national budget (operation and development), Tk. 52103.27 Crore in education budget (operation and development) and Tk. 4344.0 Crore in the Commission and University Budget (operation and development) in 2019-20 fiscal year. According to the financial year 2019-20, the share of the Commission and universities in the education budget is 8.34% and the share of the Commission and universities in the national budget is 0.87%. Tk.568000.00 Crore was allocated in the national budget(operation and development), Tk. 58059.20 Crore in the education budget (operation and development) and Tk. 5206.47 Crore in the Commission and university budget (operation and development) in 2020-21 fiscal year. According to the fiscal year 2020-21, the share of the Commission and universities in the education budget is 8.97% and the share of the Commission and universities in the national budget is 0.92%, which is 0.63% more than the Commission and universities in the education budget from the previous fiscal year and 0.05% higher than the Commission and university in the national budget.
- * In the fiscal year 2020-21, the total expenditure of the university was 75.45% for salary and pension, 18.92% for incidental cost and maintenance and 5.63% for special capital and other sector. The actual cost in the power sector is Tk. 67 Crore

and 40 Lac. To encourage university teachers in conducting research activities and introduce a quality education system, the allocation for the research sector in the fiscal year 2020-21 was Tk. 75 Crore 39 Lac and in the fiscal year 2021-22, the estimated allocation was Tk. 100 Crore 74 Lac, which is a growth rate of 34% compared to the previous year. In the laboratory equipment sector, the actual expenditure in the financial year 2020-21 was Tk. 45 Crore 220 Lac and against the backdrop of constant increase in the number of pension holders, the actual expenditure has been Tk. 587 Crore 170 Lac in the financial year 2020-21.

- * Activities with regard to formulating DPP for a feasibility study to establish National Research Council (NRC), Central Research Laboratory (CRL) and University Teachers' Training Academy (UTTA) to implement Strategic Plan for Higher Education: 2018-2030 formulated by the Commission and approved by the Government is underway.
- * The revised version of the Outcome Based Education (OBE) Curriculum Template has been formulated to develop a modern and qualitative curriculum in higher education and thus sent to all public and private universities on 30th June 2021 for its implementation. It has also been uploaded to UGC's website (www.ugc.gov.bd). In line with this, a series of workshops on the OBE Curriculum has been organized under the aegis of the Commission through expert trainers to spread the concept of the OBE curriculum among university teachers. Under these training programs, a total of 265 teachers from 23 public and 30 private universities have been imparted training in 2021. It should be noted that in the financial year 2020-21, a total of 14 public and private universities have received approval for the OBE curriculum. In addition, the universities have been directed to update the curriculum by following the Commission approved OBE template on the dual semester system and the ongoing programs of the universities are being updated accordingly.
- ** Bangladesh National Qualifications Framework (BNQF) has been formulated by the Commission under Bangladesh Accreditation Council Act 2017 to effectively conduct the activities of the Bangladesh Accreditation Council (BAC). It may be mentioned here that the framework has been approved by the Government on 31 January 2021.
- ** An information table has been prepared through several workshops to collect data on full-time equivalent researchers at the university level under SDGs indicator-9.5.2.

Based on data collection and analysis, the information chart has been inserted in the Annual Report of the Commission as per the information table.

- ❖ A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between the University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh and the Commonwealth Educational Media Center for Asia (CEMCA), India on 21 December 2021 to work jointly with UGC and British Council to provide fellowships in higher education. During the year stated above, 1,000 university teachers and officials associated with education administration have been trained on the Zoom Platform under the MoU.
- Under Commonwealth Scholarship in the UK 2022 in the year mentioned, 33 teachers have been nominated for PhD Program (Open Category), 31 teachers for Masters Program (Open Category) and 10 in Staff Category by the Commission on behalf of the Ministry of Education. Moreover, under the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science (JSPS) and UGC Joint Research Program 2022, Fellowship has been awarded to one teacher of Chittagong University.
- Fellowship has been awarded to three Professors from three public universities in Bangladesh under the UGC-UNICEF Communication for Development (C4D) Research Fellowship Award Program funded by UNICEF, Bangladesh.
- ❖ A total of 2400+ teachers from 22 universities including employees at different levels of the Commission have been imparted virtual training in Capacity Building of Higher Education Teachers of Bangladesh on Open Educational Resources (OER) and Online Education and Capacity Building Programs on Online and Blended Learning in Higher Education of Bangladesh with the help of Commonwealth of Learning. Besides, a total of 140 employees of the Commission have been given inhouse training on Conduct & Discipline, 30 on Computer Hardware & Maintenance and 48 on e-Filling by the training section of the IMCT Division, UGC to enhance the efficiency of the in-house manpower and bring in the dynamism of divisional activities of the Commission.
- Facilities of use of more than 44,000 e-resources (31,000+ e-books and 13,000+ e-journals and conference proceedings) from of the world's well-established publishers have been provided to the students, teachers and researchers of 95 institutions (Public University-35, Private Universities-55, International University-1, Research Organization-2, Training Institutes-2) through the UGC of Bangladesh. Facilities of UGC Digital Library have been extended to four more universities at present. The

number of e-resources downloaded by the universities stands at 29,530. Through a web portal of UGC Digital Library (www.udl-ugc.gov.bd), the university users are having facilities for e-resources by having direct access to the portals of the eresource providers.

- ** A total of 44 projects including 2 technical assistance programs are included in the main annual development program for the fiscal year of 2020-21. Investment of an amount of Tk. 4,15,560.00 Lac (GOB Tk.3,90,400.00 Lac and project aid Tk.25,160.00 Lac) has been made against the 42 projects. The total expenditure till December 2021 has been Tk.1,50,068.47 Lac and the actual progress rate is 36.11%.
- ** The Private University Act, 2010 was passed in the National Parliament to meet the growing demands of higher education in the 21st century. At present, the number of private universities approved by the Government stands at 108. Among them, educational activities are conducted in 99 universities located in the capital city of Dhaka and other districts of the country. Academic activities are closed in three universities and educational activities have not commenced in six universities. Out of 108 approved private universities, 33 universities are conducting academic programs on permanent campuses on the university's land as per the Private University Act, 2010. Four private universities have obtained certificate (Sanad) from the Government and three private universities have transferred all their academic programs to permanent campuses following monitoring in private universities in 2021.
- In the year 2021, four meetings of the Steering Committee formed for equivalence of * the degree obtained from foreign universities were held. The 100th meeting held on January 24, 2021, discussed 131 applications. Among them, a decision was taken on 126 applications, and five applications were not considered equivalent. The 101st meeting held on March 15, 2021 discussed about 221 applications. Among them, a decision was taken on 214 applications, and seven applications were not considered equivalent. The 102nd meeting held on June 28, 2021 discussed 129 applications. Among them, a decision was taken on 121 applications, and eight applications were not considered equivalent. The 103rd meeting held on November 07, 2021 discussed about 194 applications. Among them, a decision was taken on 189 applications, and five applications were not considered equivalent.
- ** On the occasion of the birth centenary of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman to commemorate his outstanding contribution to higher education, the University Grants Commission(UGC) of Bangladesh has introduced

'The UGC Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Fellowship' to conduct more research on overall issues of Bangladesh including Bangabandhu's long struggle, leadership and sacrifice, political philosophy, his principles and ideals in running the state, educational thought. In the light of UGC Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Fellowship Policy, Retired Professor of Biochemistry and Biochemistry Department of Bangladesh Agricultural University Dr. M. Afzal Hossain was nominated as 'UGC Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Fellow 2021'. He joined the fellowship program on August 2021 and will carry out research activities till 31 July 2022.

- * A maximum of five Professors/researchers, who are nationally and internationally renowned in the arena of teaching, research and publication are nominated as 'UGC Professors' every two years to continue their such activities. According to UGC Professorship Policy, Sultan Uddin Bhuiyan, Retired Professor of Biochemistry and Microbiology Department, Bangladesh Agricultural University,.) Dr. Sajal Krishna Banerjee, a Retired Professor of Cardiology Department of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University and Sharif Enamul Kabir, a Retired Professor of Chemistry Department, Jahangirnagar University were nominated as UGC Professor for 2 years. In addition, the Retired Professor of Life Chemistry and Microbiology Department of Dhaka University Hasina Khan earlier appointed as UGC Professor joined on 01-01-2020 in the same position for 2 years and will carry out research activities till 31 July 2022.
- * In honor of those academicians and researchers, who are playing special contributions to women's education, women's empowerment, women's development, women's leadership and the progress of women's society, one Professor/Researcher is nominated as 'Rokeya Chair' by the UGC for every two years. According to the Policy of Rokeya Chair, Dr. Amatul Laila Zaman, Professor, Department of Bangla, Chittagong University got this nomination for 2 years in 2020.
- ** According to the UGC PhD Fellowship Policy, 20 teachers from Public Universities, one teacher from Private Universities, 11 teachers from Government Colleges, 2 teachers from MPO registered colleges and 4 meritorious students have been nominated as UGC PhD Fellows in the year stated. 20 researchers have submitted their theses to the Commission after completing their research works under UGC PhD Fellowship Program from 1st January 2021 to 31st December 2021. In addition, 10 teachers-cum researchers have been awarded Post-doctoral Fellowship in 2021 as per the UGC Post-doctoral Policy in a bid to encourage practical and advanced-level research for the country.

- * In order to encourage and motivate meritorious students studying in the universities of the country as per the existing policy, one student from each faculty of the public university is given a general merit scholarship. Each scholarship holding student gets one time total Tk. 26,000 for the purchase of books monthly in addition to 2000 taka with the opportunity of free education including free educational facilities every year. A total of 132 students from 19 public universities were awarded Tk. 34,32,000.00 (Thirty-four Lac and Thirty-two Thousand) merit scholarships. Since 1995, the 'visually impaired scholarship' has been awarded every year. Under this scheme, Mr. Abdullah Al Mamun, a meritorious student of the Department of Sociology of Dhaka University, has been awarded the 'visual impaired scholarship' in the fiscal year 2020-21.
- ** A total of Tk. 47,70,000.00 (Forty-seven Lac and Seventy Thousand) has been released in favor of 179 Research Projects in Arts and Humanities, Social Sciences and Business Studies sub-sections and a total of Tk. 1,10,38,790.00 (One Crore Ten Lac Thirty-eight Thousand and Seven Hundred Ninety) against 715 Research Projects including ongoing and completed 7 sub-disciplines of Science and Technology.
- ** A total of Tk.19,90,000.00 (Nineteen Lac and Ninety Thousand) has been provided for data collection of research activities, thesis composition and binding to this end for MPhil/PhD of 76 Researchers/Institutions, Tk. 13,75,000.00 (Thirteen Lac and Seventy-five Thousand) to 13 Teachers/Institutions of Public Universities for organizing national/international seminars/symposium/conference/workshop of the country and Tk. 13,75,000.00 (Thirteen Lac and Seventy-five Thousand) and Tk. 4,90,000.00 (Four Lac and Ninety Thousand) to 12 teachers for participating in International Conferences/Seminars/Symposiums/Workshops abroad for higher degrees for overseas expenses from the Research/Education Support Fund for the year of 2021.
- * The present book collection of UGC Library stands at 14,512 copies. Among them, 10,741 copies are books, 1,021 copies of research references (MS, MPhil, PhD and Post-Doctoral), 1,460 research reports and journals 1,290. An amount of Tk. 2,07,535,00 (Two Lac Seven Thousand Five Hundred Thirty Five) has been spent for purchasing books and periodicals for the fiscal year 2020-21.
- ** With the objectives of establishing a new public university in the country, drafts of the law of Narayanganj Jatir Janak Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Science and Technology University, Dr. M A Wazed Mia Agricultural University and

Mujibnagar University have been made by the UGC in 2021 according to the election manifesto by the Hon'ble Prime Minister and sent to the Ministry of Education for further necessary action. Besides, Sheikh Hasina Medical University and Kurigram Agricultural University have been established. Preparatory activities have been undertaken at Chandpur Science and Technology University, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman University, Kishoreganj Agricultural University, Habiganj Agricultural University, Sheikh Hasina Medical University and Khulna Medical University as part of academic activities although students have not been admitted.

5. Recommendations of the Commission

The University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh presents the following recommendations for excellence in quality education, advanced research, innovation and the creation of new knowledge at the university level-

- 1. Dissemination of knowledge, creation of new knowledge and preservation of it are the basic functions of a university. With this end in view, a strategic research plan is imperative at the university level. A university may take effective measures with government and private-sector support to encourage researchers with incentives for articles published in international standard journals (high impact factor journals, Q-1/Q-2/Scopus indexed journals, etc.), to establish industry-academia linkage at the university level, build up startup and innovation hubs, ensure intellectual property rights (IPR) for patent protection and to commercialize research outputs as per the strategic research plan.
- 2. After the settlement of the disputed boundary of the Bay of Bengal with the neighboring countries Myanmar and India beyond its territorial waters, absolute authority, rights and sovereignty of Bangladesh has been established in the territorial sea of more than one Lac Eighteen Thousand and Eight Hundred Thirteen kilometers beyond its previous territorial waters. The Government should take effective measures to create a special research fund in the blue economy sector for encouraging intensive research and developing technical skills to explore and utilize minerals and other living and non-living resources within the territorial sea areas, 200 nautical miles exclusive zone and 354 nautical miles from the coast of Chittagong to the bottom of continental shelf (Mahisopan). To realize these, the Government may take necessary steps to establish centers/institutes of oceanography/oceanology in the universities.
- **3.** Local or national ranking is necessary for universities to ensure world-class higher education. To this end, the Government can take the necessary initiatives to introduce a

ranking system for the universities of the country, taking the socio-economic condition of Bangladesh, into account in the light of the model of international ranking system.

- It is urgent to use blockchain technology in the country's universities for preventing 4. certificate forgery. Through the frontier technology, the certificates will be stored in the blockchain repository and the hard copy certificates will have QR Code attached to it, which can be easily verified using a smartphone application/web application. In this regard, the Government may issue directives to the universities to take effective measures.
- 5. The Government can allocate the necessary budget for the establishment of the University Teachers' Training Academy to produce quality teachers at the university level, Central Research Laboratory to conduct advanced research and National Research Council to identify the necessary areas of research in the country.
- A colossal expansion of higher education has taken place in the country in recent times. 6. It is highly needed to formulate an academic master plan in every university to produce skilled and accomplished manpower with ethical values and ensure world-class education at the higher education level. If the academic master plan gets formulated and thus implemented, the university graduates of the country will be able to acquire skills as per the needs of the times and as a result, the prestigious position of the university will be ensured in the world ranking. Keeping this pressing issue in consideration, the Commission and the country's universities can jointly take effective measures to formulate the academic master plan on an urgent basis.
- 7. Allegations of nepotism and corruption about the appointment of teachers, officers and employees in public universities often appear in the national media. As a result, the image of higher education institutions and the Government get tarnished. An 'Independent Recruitment Commission' can be constituted to ensure transparency and accountability in the recruitment process and recruit qualified manpower. Apart from this, the university can formulate and implement policy in light of the minimum prescribed qualifications (MPQ) determining policy formulated by the UGC for the separate recruitment of its teachers, officers and employees.
- The Government, as part of the decentralization of higher education, has taken the initiative for establishing one university in each district to reach tertiary education to the doorsteps of the people. Several problems are being created in land acquisition due to the Lack of specific policies for setting up public university campuses and Bangladesh

being a densely populated country. The Government can take effective steps to formulate a policy to determine the amount of land for setting up campuses in newly established universities at a logical level.

- 9. The tendency to commence academic activities on the campus without creating minimum infrastructural facilities, laboratories and teachers' recruitment as per the physical master plan is questioning the quality of higher education. The Government and the Commission can take imitative to formulate a specific policy at which level the newly established universities can start academic activities.
- **10.** Beyond the National Pay Scale 2015, there are disparities in remuneration for additional duties in various posts, statutory bodies and committees coupled with an exam-related honorarium. Consequently, the complexity of financial management is gradually increasing. Against the backdrop of this, the Commission and Government can take measures to formulate a uniform financial policy and financial manual to restore financial order.
- 11. News of students' admission into branch campuses of non-existent foreign universities often appears in the media. It is completely illegal to set up and operate any private university in Bangladesh without obtaining a temporary permit or certificate. To expand quality higher education, reputed foreign universities may be permitted to set up and operate branch campuses with their own infrastructural and other ancillary facilities to a limited scale. However, the initiative taken by the Government to amend the Regulations for the Management of Branch Campuses or Study Centers of Foreign Universities or Institutions conflicts with the existing rules 'Private Universities Act, 2010' for setting up and managing foreign university branch campuses as well as for regular supervision. It needs to be done and implemented quickly and only after bringing this amendment permission can be given to set up branch campuses.
- 12. Meetings of the board of trustees, syndicate, finance committee and academic council are not convened regularly in several private universities. Many private universities do not have Vice-Chancellor, Pro-Vice Chancellor and Treasurer appointed by the Hon'ble Chancellor. Moreover, many universities do not prepare accounts statements following PUFR and submit their annual accounts audited to the Commission every year as per rules, resulting in a violation of the Private University Act - 2010 to a large extent, which is not at all desirable. The Government and the Commission can take more effective measures to this end.

- 13. The UGC investigates various irregularities, corruptions and other malpractices and sends a report containing recommendations to the Ministry of Education for taking further necessary actions against the persons responsible. However, it appears to the Commission that the recommendations made by the UGC do not see the light of day to a large extent. Therefore, the Commission needs to have the power to take legal measures subject to an investigation into irregularities committed in the appointment of university teachers, officers and employees, admission of additional students, certificates trade, financial irregularities and malpractices in implementations of development projects. In addition, the Government can take effective measures to empower the Commission in a bid to implement the recommendations of the inquiry report.
- **14.** Audit activities are very vital in ensuring transparency and accountability in the accounting system and bringing discipline to the financial sector by ascertaining accountability. Moreover, in University Act (where applicable), conducting audit activities by the own team of the Commission is mentioned. With this end in view, the Government and Commission can take effective measures to formulate an 'Audit Standard, Code of Ethics and Audit Manual'.
- 15. Most of the public universities of Bangladesh do not have clear guidelines and procedures for the appointment of Vice-Chancellor, Pro-Vice Chancellor and Treasurer. Even though the apex body of the country's higher education is responsible for overall supervision of higher education including ensuring quality education and research of the country's universities, no opinion from the Commission is taken in the recruitment process for these three top posts. Subject to the opinion of the Commission, the Government may frame and implementable policy for appointing Vice-Chancellor, Pro-Vice Chancellor and Treasurer from among the eminent educationists of the country.
- **16.** Programs/courses in the name of evening, weekend, executive, etc. are getting conducted in some public universities of the country at undergraduate and post-graduate levels, which is harming the overall activities of the university. All the programs/courses stated be discontinued as running such programs/courses must be against the character, image and regular students' interest of the public university. However, diploma, short course, vocational and training programs might be conducted in universities with the prior approval from the UGC as per the specific policy in a bid to produce skilled and accomplished manpower.
- 17. In the developed world, there is a practice of granting student loan to learners while studying in universities and repaying them later after entering into working life or in

some other way. In that light, the Government can take initiatives to provide financial support to the poor students studying in universities in Bangladesh by forming an endowment fund to launch an education loan scheme for the students.

6. International Collaboration and Memorandum of Understandings (MoU) Signed

Like 2020, in 2021 too, a significant number of representatives/delegations of foreign organizations/universities arrived at the Commission. They exchanged views on international collaboration and cooperation with the Hon'ble Chairman and Members of the Commission. Apart from this, various training, higher education and research cooperation are provided to teachers and officers at the academic and non-academic level of UGC and universities under MoUs of various universities and institutions of the world with the Commission.

On 07-07-2021 in the year under discussion, MoU between the University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh and the Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia (CEMCA), India is signed. Under the MoU, 1,000 university teachers and officials associated with the education administration were trained on the Zoom platform. Also on 21-12-2021 MoU between the University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh and the British Council Bangladesh (Operational Alliance) is signed.

7. Research Support Activities of the Commission

7.1 Research Project, Scholarship, Gold Medal, Scholarship and Fellowship

Prime Minister Gold Medal, UGC Gold Medal, UGC Merit Scholarship, Visually Impaired Scholarship, UGC Professorship, Rokeya Chair, and Post-doctoral Fellowship are awarded by the Commission. Apart from this, all international-related activities including the Commonwealth Scholarship, Commonwealth Academic Staff Award, SAARC Chair and Scholarship, and equalization of degrees obtained from abroad with Bangladesh degrees are being conducted.

Considering the immense importance of research in the field of higher education, the Research Support and Publication Division of UGC regularly provides various types of scholarships and fellowships for research in the universities of the country. In 2021, 1 person has been awarded UGC Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Fellowship, 10 people have been awarded a post-doctoral fellowship with financial allocation for 894 research projects, 37 people have received PhD, 132 people have been awarded merit scholarships, 1 person has been awarded Rokeya Chair and 5 people have been awarded UGC Professorship. More scholarships and fellowships have been awarded in this regard than last year.

8. Financial Statements of Research Projects of Commission and Public Universities

8.1 Academic Research Projects of the Commission in 2021

Out of a total of 1,308 research projects under the Academic Staff Development Program in 2021, 210 research projects in Arts and Humanities, Social Sciences and Business Studies and 1,098 in Science and Technology. Among them 249 completed projects, 894 ongoing projects and 165 canceled projects.




Figure 2: Annual Non-development Grants of Public Universities for the Last Ten Financial Years






Figure 3: Percentage (%) of Total Students in Public Universities




Figure 4: Percentage (%) of Male and Female Students in Private Universities




Figure 5: Number of Public and Private Universities and Affiliated, Constituent Colleges/Madrasas in 2021




Figure 6: Comparative Statistics of Foreign Students Studying in Public and Private Universities for Last Ten Years




Figure 7: Statistics of Total Number of Students of Public and Private Universities for Last Five Years




Figure 8: Percentage (%) of Students in Public Universities, its Affiliated and Constituent Colleges and Madrasas




Figure 9: Number of Students in Public Universities for Last Ten Years




Figure 10: Number of Students in Private Universities for Last Ten Years




Figure 11: Percentage (%) of Faculty-wise Students in 47 Universities (Excluding Affiliated and Constituent Madrasas)




Figure 12: Percentage (%) of Faculty-wise Students of Public Universities excluding Students of Affiliated and Affiliated Colleges/Madrasas




Figure 13: Number of Faculty-wise Students in Private Universities




Figure 14: Number of Degree-wise Students of 47 Public Universities (Excluding Affiliated and Constituent Colleges/Madrasas)




Figure 15: Number of Subject-wise Students of 50 Public Universities (Excluding 14 Affiliated and Constituent Colleges/Madrasas)




Figure 16: Degree-wise Students Number in Private Universities




Figure 17: Comparative Percentage (%) of Degree Awardees at Different Levels of Public Universities in 2020 and 2021




Figure 18: Comparative Percentage (%) of Degree Awardees at Different Levels of Private Universities in 2020 and 2021




Figure 19: Comparative Statistics of Post-wise teachers in Public and Private Universities in 2021




Figure 20: Comparative Number of Degree-wise Teachers in Public Universities for Last Three Years




Figure 21: Comparative Number of Total Teachers Having PhD Degree of Private Universities for Last Five Years




Figure 22: Percentage (%) of Students Enjoying Residential Facilities in 50 Public Universities




Figure 23: Percentage (%) of Students Enjoying Residential Facilities in 99 Private Universities

38. Information Regarding Private Universities

The number of public universities is meager in proportion to the population and the demand for higher education in the country. Higher education is hampered by limited seats and a deficit in the national education budget. In this context, following the model of India, Pakistan and Japan the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh enacted the Private University Act 1992 in accordance with the recommendations of the University Grants Commission of Bangladesh for the establishment of private universities in the country for the expansion of higher education. Subsequently, some amendments were made to Act No. 3 of the Private University Act 1998.

A new law was enacted to abolish the existing law for the establishment and management of private universities to expand quality higher education in the country, and soon after, the law was approved by the Parliament on 18 July 2010 (3rd Srabon 1417) was published for the public.

38.1 Terms and Conditions for Provisional Permission to Establish Private University

According to the Private University Act 2010, the following conditions must be met for a temporary permit to establish a private university:

(1) For the purpose of establishing and running the proposed private university, a Board of Trustees consisting of not more than 21 (Twenty-one) and not less than 9 (Nine) members should be formed:

- (2) For the purpose of temporary permission, a proposed private university must have a plan approved by the Commission supporting its educational activities;
- (3) The number of full-time teachers to be appointed by the Commission for each department, program and course in a proposed private university shall be fixed;
- (4) Initially, a proposed private university should have at least three faculties and at least 6 (Six) departments under that faculty;
- (5) Each faculty must have the required educationally qualified experienced teachers approved by the Grants Commission;
- (6) The proposed private university shall have an adequate number of classrooms, libraries, laboratories, seminar rooms, office rooms, separate common rooms for students and other necessary rooms, and adequate space in its own or rented building of at least 25,000 (Twenty-five Thousand) square feet area;
- (7) At least 5 (Five) Crore for Dhaka and Chittagong metropolitan areas, at least 3 (Three) Crore for other metropolitan areas and 1.5 (One Crore and Fifty Lac) for other areas as funds reserved in the name of the proposed private university must be deposited in any scheduled bank;
- (8) An initially proposed private university may be temporarily housed in its own or rented building with an area of at least 25,000 (Twenty-five Thousand) square feet. However, within 7 (Seven) years from the date of temporary establishment, it is necessary to set up its campus permanently by constructing adequate infrastructure on 1 (One) acre in the name of the University in the case of Dhaka and Chittagong metropolitan area for the University approved by the Government and at least 2 (Two) acres for other regions shall be uninterrupted unallocated land;
- (9) At least 6% of the full-time students enrolled in each academic year of the private university, out of which 3% of seats are reserved for offspring of freedom fighters and 3% for meritorious but poor students of the remotest and underdeveloped areas, along with a list of such students studying in each academic year must be submitted to the University Grants Commission;
- (10) Every private university shall inform the University Grants Commission about the student fee structure consistent with the standards of socio-economic conditions of the country;



- (11) Every Private University shall inform the University Grants Commission about appropriate salary structure and employment regulations which are prepared for teachers, officers and staff:
- (12) Each Private University shall have a General Fund and will deposit tuition and session fees collected from students and money received from other sources to the General Fund and meets all expenditures from this fund.

39. Information about Students Availing Full Free Studentship, Scholarship and Waiver Facilities of Private Universities

- (a) The total number of students availing full free studentship, scholarship and waiver facilities in private universities in the same year is 15,042; 77,500 and 14,283 respectively.
- (b) The freedom fighters are the country's best offspring; considering their financial wellbeing and social establishment, the present Government is taking and implementing various programs. For the children of freedom fighters to get higher education, 3% of the total number of seats has been reserved in the 'Private University Act 2010'. Under this act, 1,688 children of freedom fighters are studying in various private universities free of cost during the year.
- (c) To reach higher education opportunities, the Government has reserved 3% of the total seats for poor but deserving students in the 'Private University Act 2010'. Under this act, 10,569 poor and meritorious students are studying free of cost in the current year.

Statistics of the Recruitment for the posts of Vice Chancellor, Pro-**40.** Vice Chancellor and Treasurer of Private Universities

According to the information sent from the respective universities in the year, among 108 approved private universities 69 Vice Chancellors 24 Pro-Vice Chancellors and 57 Treasurers have been appointed by the Hon'ble President and Chancellor. It is to be noted that only 15 universities have filled the three posts of Vice Chancellor, Pro-Vice Chancellor and Treasurer appointed by His Excellency the President.

41. Audit Report of Income and Expenditure of Private Universities

According to the data sent from their respective universities, out of 108 approved private universities (in 2021, the approved university number is 108; 6 universities have not started and no data of IBAIS University, The University of Comilla and Queen's University have been added as directed by the Commission) only 61 universities have sent their Audited Financial Report by an audit firm formed by Ministry of Education to the Monitoring Cell of the UGC.

42. Income and Expenditure of Private Universities

- (A) **Income:** The total income of active 99 universities is BDT 3,26,117 Lac and the average amount is BDT 3,290.32 Lac in 2021.
- (B) **Expenditure:** In 2021, the total expenditure of the mentioned universities is BDT 3,26,117 Lac and the average amount is BDT 3,705.87 Lac.
- (C) **Expenditure in Library and Laboratory:** In 2021, the total expenditure for the library sector of 86 private universities is BDT 6500.68 Lac and the average amount is BDT 75.59 Lac. In the same year, the total expenditure in the laboratory sector of 69 private universities is BDT 8,022.30 Lac and the average amount is BDT 116.65 Lac.
- (D) **Per Student Expenditure:** In 2021, the expenditure amount of private universities is BDT 84,35,07.00 and the average amount is BDT 85,202.09.
- (E) **Expenditure in Research Sector:** According to the information sent by the private universities, 78 universities have spent in the research sector. The total amount of expenditure in the section is BDT 11988.00 Lac and the average amount is BDT 153.69 Lac.

43. Statistics of Various Committee Meetings Held by Private Universities in 2021

A total of 1,058 meetings have been held in private universities in the current year. Among the meetings held were 392 Board of Trustees, 208 Syndicates, 262 Academic Councils and 196 Finance Committees. It is to be noted that 131 meetings is increased than last year.





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
