
We put special emphasis on ICT, Science and Technology based education. At least one university will be set up in each district of the country.

The Handbook would hopefully cover useful references and information required by students, teachers, and researchers of our country and those willing to pursue higher studies in Bangladesh from abroad.



## FOREWORD



It can be added here that while there will be an increasing demand for the establishment of universities in the future, ensuring quality education in these universities is a must as there is no alternative to sustainable education in order to build a developed nation as well as to meet the challenges of this millennium. In this regard, the University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh is relentlessly putting its best efforts in promoting, monitoring and maintaining the standard of university education and undertaking adaptable initiatives to facilitate quality education and research programs at the tertiary level of education.
