From the Desk of the Editor

We lost Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman in the fateful night of 15 August 44 years ago when a section of disgruntled Army officers killed him and most of his family. The great leader whom the contemporary history has recognised as the greatest Bengali of a thousand years was brutally killed in less than four years after he assumed office as the founding President following Bangladesh's victory against Pakistani occupation forces through a bloody nine-month war. Bangabandhu is no more physically present among us, but he is always among us as a guiding force of the nation and remains equally relevant these days too and will be as he was even since before the birth of Bangladesh.

The discrimination by the West Pakistani rulers against the then East Pakistan, now Bangladesh, in their 24 years' rule left Bangladesh far behind the western part in almost all fields, including economy, education and infrastructures. discrimination was the main factor behind Bengalis standing against Pakistani rulers waging for struggles determination. After the independence, Bangabandhu made all possible efforts to elevate Bangladesh economically and socially with the vision to turn it Sonar Bangla (Golden Bangla). He took many decisions for the expansion of education with the understanding that the nation cannot develop without proper education. It was Bangabandhu who founded University Grants of Bangladesh (UGC) Bangladesh for the promotion of higher He constituted education. Qudrat-e-Khuda Education Commission for bringing major changes in the education system suitable for the new nation.

Honourable Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, the daughter of the Bangabandhu, has been working relentlessly to accomplish many unfinished works of the country's founding father. Anyone will credit her with the colossal expansion of higher education in Bangladesh through establishment of a large number of institutions both in public and private sectors.

Bangladesh is going to celebrate the birth centenary of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman from March 17 next year. It is very delightful that education sector will be given special attention during the year-long celebration of the birth centenary dubbed Mujib Borsho (Mujib Year).

University Grants Commission (UGC) of Bangladesh has selected four renowned researchers of the country as UGC Professors for the next two years. The decision was unanimously taken at a meeting held on August 6 with Professor Dr. Kazi Shahidullah, Chairman of UGC, in the chair.

The selected UGC Professors were Dr. Fakrul Alam, retired Professor of English Department at the University of Dhaka, Dr. Khorshed Ahmed Kabir, retired Professor of Nuclear Engineering at the University of Dhaka, Dr. ABM Abdullah, retired Professor of Medicine at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University, and Dr. Md. Abdul Mannan Akanda, former Vice Chancellor and retired Professor of Plant Pathology at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Agricultural University.

According to UGC Professorship Guideline, retired renowned researchers of Bangladesh are

given UGC professorship. The UGC Professor will receive a monthly honorarium, which shall be equivalent to the highest monthly salary of a Selection Grade Professor. The UGC Professor will be attached to a university or an approved research institution of his/her choice.


association with UGC and agriculture universities, is preparing a strategic plan for development of our agricultural education".

UGC signs deal with university teachers to publish textbooks in higher education

Workshop on 'Status of the IQACs at Public Universities: Ways to Step Forward' at UGC



UGC arranged a day-long workshop titled "Status of the IQACs at Public Universities: Ways to Step Forward" at its auditorium on September 9. Professor Kazi Shahidullah, Chairman of UGC, as the chief guest graced the event, presided over by Professor Dr. Muhammed Alamgir, in-charge of the SPQA Division at UGC.

The UGC Chairman, in his speech, said the Commission is enhancing its monitoring activities to ensure the quality of tertiary education in the country. "Quality education depends on high-quality faculties. Faculty members need to improve their knowledge and skills continuously for the development of the students. Otherwise, they have to face difficulties as UGC is enhancing its monitoring activities," he said.

The UGC Chairman urged the university teachers not to give GPA 4 or highest GPA unnecessarily in the name of quality enhancement. "UGC wants to ensure the quality, first. Because, our graduates lack quality and skills. Employers become losers for hiring unskilled graduates," he said adding IQAC would play an important role in enhancing the quality of tertiary education.

Speaking at the programme, UGC Member Professor Dr. Muhammed Alamgir said the outcome of the workshop will provide very decisive lights to the IQAC of all public universities as well as UGC for the development of quality culture in higher education.

• The final draft of Outcome Based Education (OBE) Curriculum Template was presented in the 156th Full Commission meeting of UGC on September 24 for its approval. As per decisions of the meeting, the draft was sent to country's all public universities and uploaded on the UGC website seeking opinions from relevant stakeholders before finalising the template.

- · The Ministry of Education asked University Grants Commission of Bangladesh to form a probe committee to investigate the allegations brought against former Vice Chancellor of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Science and Technology University, Gopalgani Professor Dr. Khondoker Md. Nasiruddin on September 23. After receiving the directives of MoE, UGC formed an investigation committee headed by its Member Professor Dr. Muhammed Alamgir to look into the matter. Other Members of the Committee were UGC Members Professor Dr. Dil Afroza Begum and Professor Dr. Md. Sazzad Hossain, Director of UGC Public University Management Division Mr. Md. Kamal Hossain and Deputy Director Ms. Mauli Azad. The team visited the university on September 25 and 26 and talked to the Vice Chancellor, agitating students, teachers and officials of the university. UGC submitted the investigation report to the Ministry of Education.
